




# **Announcing The 2024 SGP Recipients!**

On June 14th, a cloudy and windy morning, Francis and Elizabeth from Connecticut stopped by the trailhead. They walked about half of Trail A and then were on their way to Courthouse and Jail rocks. All 50 states have now been represented by visitors at WTTR!



Sophie and Jos from Winterswyk, Holland (Netherlands) made a stop at Chimney Rock on June 22nd. They are visiting Overland trails landmarks.



Ollie and Carolyn from Munich, Germany are walking the trails this afternoon. They scoff at the heat! (It reached 104 degrees on June 24th) They are visiting western sites: Black Hills, Bighorn Mtns.

Almost 700 people have visited WTTR over the past couple of weeks which is slightly surprising given all the storms in the area. The visitors included Pony Express Riders who were "recreating the ride" and Boy Scout Troops from Lincoln, NE and Riley, Kansas.

Sandra Reddish, Western Nebraska Coordinator, said the Big Horn Sheep have moved out of the area so now visitors are using the Spotting Scope to take photos of the top of Chimney Rock.

Native grasses and plants are appearing along the trails as a result of the reseeding by NRD. Wildflowers are blooming: Spiderwort, Scarlet Globe Mallow, White Penstemon, Gumbo Lilly, Prickly Poppy, Prickly Pear, Western Salsify, and Skeletonweed.


