## Statewide Grant Site Visits with Sue Quambusch



The day I chose to make this trip was the day after a wonderfully warm one. This day was blustery and windy from the moment I left until well after I got back to Lincoln. The big check was flying around all day and I'm lucky it didn't take off at one of the places I visited. My first stop was **Abie's Place** in Abie, to pick up a half dozen kolaches for each site. Tonnette is the owner and her kolaches are really good! After that, I headed to Clarkson, stopping first at the **Clarkson Historical Museum** which is located on Pine Street in downtown Clarkson. Ruth Waters, Board President, welcomed me and we enjoyed a kolache together. After this, we were off on a tour of the museum. The building started off as a hardware store that then turned into a funeral home and served several purposes after that before becoming the museum it is

today. I guess any building that is over 100 years old has a variety of uses!

Ruth and her volunteers have set up the museum so that there are at least 20 different exhibits and there is also a genealogy room for anyone who wants to do family research. The museum was given a **\$400 grant to purchase display cases for a large collection of Czech pottery** that was gifted to the museum by Betty Dasenbrock of Lincoln. Ruth had to travel to Omaha to find the display cases she wanted.

I drove on to Newman Grove, a town of about 1,000 people. I met with Kathy Strong, the Director of the **Newman Grove Library**. They are conveniently located across the street from the school complex so it is easily accessible to the students. This site received a grant for **\$500 for their 100-year celebration** in the summer of 2023. Kathy and her volunteers decorated the library with "Books Through the Decades" of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. They also had a float in the parade which had a children's book for each decade from the 1920s to 2013.



After a quick and delicious lunch at City Café in Newman Grove, I drove another 20 minutes to St. Edward where I visited with Vickie Fritzges, Director of the **St. Edward Public Library**. This library was built in 2006 and it is bright and airy and holds a lot of books for everyone. She is going to rearrange her collections so that there is a dedicated reference section for people who want to do research. They were given a gift that created a Genealogy research room, and she has a lot of reference material there as well. This site received a **grant of \$550 for speakers** who have been coming to the library since last summer. Included among their speakers are <u>Yvonne</u> Hollenbeck "Fabulous Feedsack Era"; Jody Lamp, "Stories



from Nebraska's Agricultural History" and "Born to Rein"; Mary Kay Quinlan "Introduction to Oral History"; Beth Sparrow "Beginning Genealogy"; and Janie York "Quilting Your Legacy." They also had a local quilter from Belgrade who presented a program on quilts and vintage fabrics. Some of the funds went to adding materials to their Genealogy room.

This was my last stop and it was a big day. I cannot overemphasize how important the Statewide Grants Program is for the people and their organizations I have visited over the past few years. All of them are genuinely nice people and are working hard to preserve history — in their own towns and in their own ways.
