New this year...



Deadline Are Approaching - Apply Today!



Applications for the <u>Statewide Grants Program</u> are now open. Grants range from \$100 to \$3,000. The main focus areas for grant distributions from the Statewide Grants Program will assist local historical efforts on the part of historical societies, museums, archives, libraries, etc. Grants should be for core educational, preservation, and interpretive purposes. **Applications must be received by April 30th.**

NSHSF - Dr. Don R. Gerlach Education Fund

On January 15, 2024, NSHSF Trustee Dr. Don R. Gerlach, Professor of History Emeritus at the University of Akron, Ohio, passed away at the age of 91.

Dr. Gerlach received bachelor's, master's, and

doctorate degrees from the University of Nebraska in 1954, '56, and '61, and he taught there in 1961-62 before accepting a position at the University of Akron. Dr. Gerlach retired from teaching in 1993. Since 2010, he has resided in the 1919 home his grandparents acquired in 1929.

Dr. Gerlach has written numerous books and articles on General Philip Schuyler and the American Revolution, as well as other subjects of early American history, such as Samuel Johnson of Connecticut - an Anglican convert and missionary who became the first president of King's College, which later became Columbia University.

Dr. Gerlach has contributed articles for the Clay County Historical Society about the War of 1812 veteran buried in the Harvard Cemetery, and the five generations of Gerlachs in Clay County since 1886. He has contributed or written texts for four state historical markers out of the six that currently stand in Harvard.

In 2015, Dr. Gerlach successfully led a campaign to rescue Harvard's historic jailhouse from dilapidation. This building is over a century old, and was featured in David Hendee's *Nebraska: 150 Years Told Through 93 Counties* (2016). The jail gained national notoriety in 1943 when a local teenager bought the property for back taxes and then sold it to Edgar Bergan's Charlie McCarthy for \$10,000 as a fundraiser for a new Naval ship.

The Nebraska State Historical Society Foundation's finance and executive committees have suggested that an educational fund be established in his name. Memorials may be made to the **NSHSF** – **Dr. Don R. Gerlach Education Fund**. As a lifelong learner and educator, we think this is an appropriate and respectful way to honor Dr. Gerlach's life and his many achievements.
