Jim Nissen served on the NSHS Foundation board of trustees from 1984 until his passing on August 8. So many of you replied with stories of kindness and of the great things he did - for this foundation and for the Society. We appreciate his service and his dedication to our organization as well as so many other Nebraska nonprofits.

Many of you know Jim from his career in banking. Jim was a life-long Lincoln banker whose career spanned six decades. Before he retired from Wells Fargo Bank in 2009, he served as President and CEO of National Bank of Commerce and Vistar Bank, and served on the State Nebraska Bank and Trust board in Wayne, NE. He served as president of the Nebraska Bankers Association, Lincoln Chamber of Commerce, and Bryan Memorial Hospital Foundation. Jim was a trusted and devoted community volunteer including as president and trustee. Organizations included Lancaster County American Red Cross, United Way, Lincoln Foundation, Bryan Memorial Hospital, Wayne State College Foundation, University of Nebraska Foundation, and Nebraska Wesleyan.

Special Purpose Fall Grant Cycle Deadline September 15th!

The Nebraska State Historical Society Foundation launched a <u>Special Purpose Grant</u> Cycle. Applications are due September 15, 2024 and selected grantees will be notified in October of 2024. Preference is given to non-profit organizations operating in and serving local communities. For this Fall session grants of up to \$1,000 will be awarded.

The focus areas for grant distributions will assist local historical efforts on the part of historical entities. Grants should be for special projects and must be used by May 31, 2025. Examples of special projects are: speakers; education materials for project acquisitions that enhance content or the visitor's experience; fees for students to visit a museum; gas expenses for school bus transportation; registration costs for conferences and statewide meetings; and grants for professional development conferences and webinars.

Sandra Redding, Western Nebraska Coordinator, said there were some first time visitors from the Scottsbluff/Gering area. International visitors included residents of Canada, Netherlands, South Africa, Spain, Belgium, India, Russia and Germany.
