Original essay (two full pages, double spaced, 12-point type) Al Generated essays will be rejected. Essay topics include:

- What does it mean to you that one of the sailors came from your town or geographic area?
- Choose a Nebraska sailor using the books by author T. J. Thedens *USS Utah* or *USS Arizona*, that you can find in your school library, and research their lives.
- Interview a person who participated in the North Platte Canteen.
- What impact did the war effort have on your town? Interview an elder in your town.
- Please research the sailor in your area whose sacrifice made it possible for you to apply for this scholarship. How did WWII impact your community? If a similar situation were to occur today, what do you think the response would be?
